ACTION / SUMMARY INFORMATION

Action: Open this Defect Petition for a grant or deny decision.

Summary:

The petition was submitted by the Center for Auto Safety (CAS) located in Washington, DC. CAS states that it has identified 57 consumer complaints submitted to the agency that allege a stall or loss of motive power involving model year 2017 Chrysler Pacifica. Based on the reports, CAS requests that the agency determine that the 2017 Pacifica contains a defect that relates to motor vehicle safety, and further requests that the Agency issue a recall order pursuant to Federal law. According to CAS, drivers are unable to accelerate, decelerate, or utilize power steering, thus placing them at increased risk of a crash. CAS further alleges that dealership service personnel are unable to identify and correct the cause of the stalling condition. A copy of the petition and related documents provided by CAS will be made available in the public file for this action at NHTSA.gov.

This defect petition has been opened to evaluate the issue and determine whether to grant or deny the petition.
