Defect Description:

In certain vehicles, the single-stage passenger airbag inflator could produce excessive internal pressure. If an affected airbag deploys, the increased internal pressure may cause the inflator housing to rupture. Metal fragments could pass through the airbag cushion material possibly causing injury or death to vehicle occupants.

Reason U.S. Vehicles Not Affected

The affected vehicles in foreign markets were equipped with single-stage inflators for the passenger's airbag module. U.S. model Civic vehicles for the 2001-2003 model years were equipped with a completely different dual-stage inflator passenger airbag module and we have received no similar reports for dual stage passenger airbag modules. The Fit was not sold in the U.S. until the 2007 model year, and was also equipped with a dual-stage inflator at that time, as opposed to the single-stage inflator design subject to this recall in certain foreign markets. Neither the Stream or any identical or substantially similar vehicle has ever been sold in the U.S.
