
Small part, big recall

Toyota Canada is suspending sales of eight models because of problems with sticking accelerator pedals. It is also recalling millions of vehicles, including more than a quarter of a million in Canada. This recall is separate to the company's ongoing recall, involving pedals getting trapped by floor mats.



WHAT TO DO

If the pedal sticks or returns slowly to the idle position, apply the brakes in a firm and steady manner. Don't pump the brakes. Bring your vehicle to a stop at the nearest safe location, shut the engine off and contact a Toyota dealer.
